National Security Law Journal to host a panel on Targeted Sanctions

ARLINGTON, VA — The *National Security Law Journal* at Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University will host its fall symposium, *Security in the New Era of Targeted Sanctions* on Monday, November 13, 2017. The event is co-hosted by the *National Security Institute* in the Law School. The event will feature three panelists: Mr. Mark Katz, Professor at the Schar School of Policy and Government, Mr. Gregory Koblentz, Professor at the Schar School of Policy and Government, Mr. Adam Smith, Partner in the Washington, D.C. office of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher, and Dr. Andrea Viski, Director at the Strategic Trade Research Institute. Jamil Jaffer, Professor of Law of the Antonin Scalia Law School at George Mason University, will serve as the moderator.

The panel will discuss targeted sanctions against Russia and North Korea among other countries. Some of the focus of the discussion will be the Magnitsky Act as well as the recertification of the Iranian sanction. "Given the timeliness of the use of sanctions these past few months, we believed that we were faced with a unique opportunity to host a discussion on a topic that has recently been faced with controversy from within the current administration," said Max Ross, the Editor-In-Chief of the *Journal*. "Our goal is to create an environment for our audience to hear and ask about the use and current application of targeted sanctions from varied perspectives. We are thrilled to host this panel and we expect the discussion surrounding the practice and administration of sanctions to be lively and dynamic," Ross continued.

The event will be held on Monday November 13, 2017, from 12:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. in the Founders Hall Auditorium on George Mason's Arlington Campus, located at 3351 Fairfax Drive, Arlington, VA.
